Summary Duties

In connection with miscellaneous construction, alteration, and repair activities at various locations in the Power System, directs a crew of journeymen and their helpers engaged in rigging, placing, assembling, and erecting structural steel members, and shapes, doing related and incidental welding and cutting and in rigging for the movement and placing of heavy materials and equipment, erecting and placing cranes, derricks, gin poles and other equipment for handling heavy loads; examines and interprets instructions, orders, plans and specifications, and observes and analyzes site of proposed work; plans, lays out and coordinates proposed work with other crafts; determines methods and tools to be employed; assigns and reviews tasks and assumes responsibility for quality and quantity of work during progress and after completion; encourages safe practices and enforces safety rules and precautions; approves workmen's timecards; makes oral and written reports on work progress, materials used and accidents; hears and settles grievances or refers them to superior; and performs related duties.

Overtime:

An employee shall be compensated, at a rate computed by multiplying the hourly rate by one and one-half (1½), for the following time worked: the first two (2) hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day, Monday through Friday; and the first eight (8) hours worked on Saturday. An employee shall be compensated, at a rate computed by multiplying the hourly rate by two (2), for the following time worked: all hours worked on Sundays and recognized holidays; all hours worked in excess of ten (10) hours, Monday through Friday; and all hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours on Saturday.
